Preparedness and Health and Safety Services


- Become a Community Disaster Preparedness Instructor.
- Host a preparedness fair.
- Get trained in CPR, AED and First Aid.





Blood Services

- Host a blood drive at our school.
- Help at blood centers.
- Make thank-you cards for blood donors.
- Donate blood.





Service to the Armed Forces

- Make holiday cards for service members and veterans for Holiday Mail for Heroes Campaign.
- Host gift drive at Veteran's Hospital.
- Build care packages.





Disaster Services

- Help clean and maintain Emergency Response Vehicles.
- Take disaster training courses to become a disaster responder and join a Disaster Action Team (DAT).





International Services

- Organize a fundraiser/awareness event to benefit the Measles and Rubella Initiative.
- Host a panel discussion to discuss
 International Humanitarian Law.





Fundraising

- Host a raffle, bake sale, and coin drive.





Steps to Starting a Red Cross Club

- 1. Recruit "start up people"
- 2. Find a Sponsor/Advisor
- Get approval from Red Cross Unit
- 4. Get approval from School
- 5. Register the Club
- 6. Hold first Club Meeting
- Keep in contact with the Red Cross Unit


